Benefit/cost of PPR eradication is reported to be 34 (!)

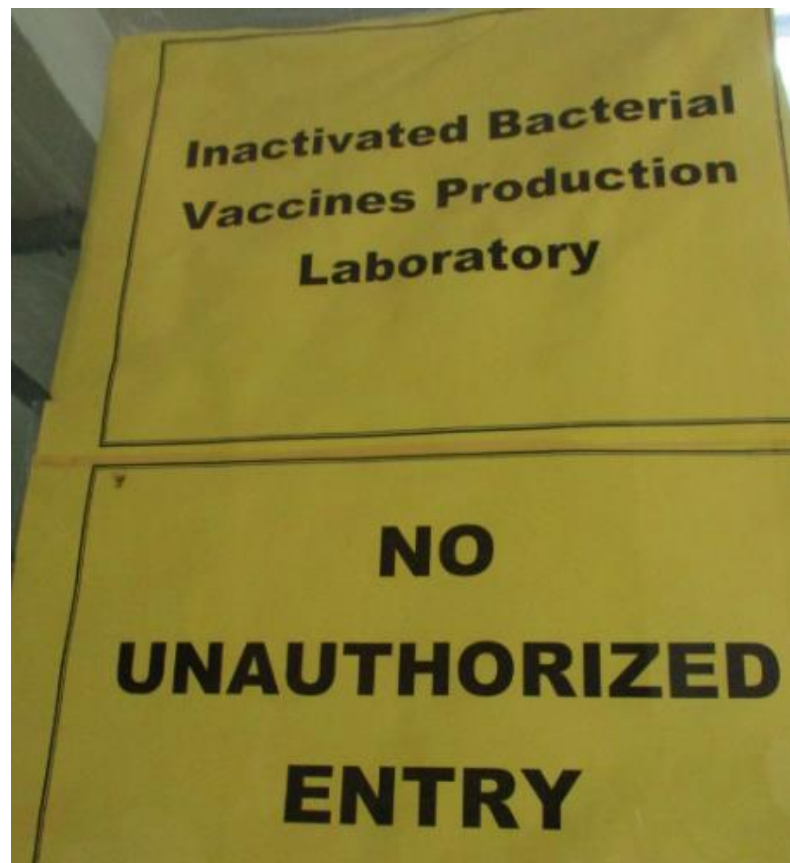
